We welcome those who will complete their Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil into the Church. May God bless Phil Limper and the team, our candidates and catechumens, and all those anticipating being a part of the RCIA program next year. Imagine that... we already have some signed up for next year!

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. The week focuses on the celebration of the Paschal Mystery in a particular way. On Thursday evening we will celebrate the Mass of the Lord’s Supper beginning at 7:00pm. This night we will remember Jesus’ servant-leadership in the washing of the feet. You will be invited to have your feet washed too. There will be Eucharistic Adoration (not exposition) from the time of Mass until 12:midnight. Then on Friday we will focus on the death of Jesus at the Good Friday Service at 7:00pm. We will recount the road from the Garden of Gethsemane to the Calvary Hill. There will be veneration of the cross and Holy Communion. Finally, at the Easter Vigil, celebrated on Saturday night at 7:00pm. We will commemorate the Resurrection of Jesus with fire, word, song, water, oil, and bread. This is the high point of every Christian’s liturgical life. Still basking in the light of the Easter Vigil, Easter Sunday Masses will be at 8:00 & 10:30am. All are welcome to attend our Triduum and Easter Liturgies!

May God bless you and your families during these final days of Lenten preparation for the great celebration of Easter.

## Around the Church

**Palm Sunday: Do You Shout “Hosanna” or “Crucify Him?”** The Gospel story of Jesus’ triumphant entry into Jerusalem warms the heart of every Christian. Can you imagine being there – standing along the Hosanna Way from the Mount of Olives to Jerusalem, waving palm branches and shouting praises to Jesus Christ, the long-awaited Messiah? Would the cheers of “Hosanna” still be ringing in our ears five days later as Jesus stumbled along the Via Dolorosa from Pilate’s Praetorium to Mount Calvary to the shouts of, “Crucify Him, crucify Him?” It may be hard to admit, but we all share in a similar pattern in our own lives, although most of us do not experience the extremes that Jesus did. There are highs and lows, good days and bad days, and we draw our strength from knowing that Jesus is always with us. The Christians that live in the Holy Land are no different. Many are descendants of the early Christians from the time of Christ, and they have the joy and blessing of living close to the Holy Sites. However, they have also suffered times of condemnation and persecution throughout the centuries. Their suffering has gotten so acute in the past several decades that Christians are being forced to leave their homeland in order to make a decent living. If this trend is not reversed soon, the only Christians in the Holy Land will be those on pilgrimage. You may ask: “Why should I care?” So often, in our own parishes, we lose sight that the Catholic Church is bigger than our parish boundaries or even our diocese. We have Catholic brothers and sisters all around the world, celebrating Mass in every language on the planet. The Holy Land is truly special – this is where Jesus was born and grew up. This is where He preached, healed the sick, performed miracles and announced the coming of the Kingdom. This is where He suffered, died and rose again to achieve victory over sin and death. Anyone who has made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land will tell you that walking in the footsteps of Jesus is a life-changing experience. It is the responsibility of all Christians around the world to ensure that the Holy Land maintains a Christian presence and to pray for peace in this area of long-standing animosity and violence. We are the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church! In addition to your prayers for peace, another way you can help is to make a generous contribution to the Pontifical Good Friday Collection whose monies go the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land, who maintain many of the Holy Sites and sponsor numerous apostolate that support the Christian population. A task so menial, lords and ladies do not do it. But the Lord Jesus does. No task is beneath his doing – nor ours. We also hear of dining on bread/ wine irrevocably changed. This repeatable task is for remembering liturgically Jesus the Christ and his Paschal Mystery in Body and Blood. What must I do? How will I be at the service of others? eek? How will I “remember” the Christ – and thus remember us all?


